

Our church follows the "liturgical calendar." For millennia, Christians have used this system to organize each year around the life of Christ. The Church Year begins at Advent, as we wait for the arrival of Jesus celebrated at Christmas. During Epiphany, we celebrate Christ revealing himself to the world. In Lent, we prepare for the remembrance of Christ's death during Holy Week and resurrection at Easter. On Pentecost, we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit, who sustains us in our life in Christ during the season known as Ordinary time.

New here? Holy Trinity is an Episcopal Church, part of the worldwide Anglican Communion. Worship in our tradition is liturgical, which means that we use written prayers. This is an ancient, biblical way to pray. The liturgy makes worship something the community does, not just the minister up front. It helps us when our own words fail. It ensures we receive a steady diet of God's Word. And it reminds us every week of God's grace in Jesus Christ.

How We Worship: We worship in heart, body, & mind. To help, we sometimes kneel or stand. This bulletin will be your guide. It will have all the responses printed inside. The service music is printed in the bulletin; the hymns can be found in the blue *Hymnal 1982* (marked with "H") or the red/black *Lift Every Voice & Sing II* (marked with LEVAS).

Worship Following a Pandemic: We learned a lot over the last years. Remember to wash your hands after using the restroom. If you are feeling sick/unwell, consider joining us virtually for worship.

Restrooms: Single-stall, all-gender restrooms are available by the church office. Simply walk into the narthex (lobby), walk straight and turn left at the hallway. All bathrooms are handicap accessible and changing tables are available in both restrooms.

The PrayGround & Children's Chapel: To the left of the altar, in the trancept, we have a space for families and children to participate in worship. The PrayGround provides space to move, activities & prime viewing for kids to see the service. Children & families are welcome to enter the PrayGround at anytime during the service—children should be accompanied by an adult. We also provide children's chapel during the sermon, exiting after the Gospel.



First Reading

Acts 4:5-12

The rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is `the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone.' There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

1 John 3:16-24

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us-- and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples. which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

All baptized Christians, regardless of age or denomination, are welcome to receive Communion at the Lord's Table. Come forward by rows and kneel at the altar rail. Kneel on the right (lectern side) if you wish to intinct; kneel on the left (pulpit side) if you wish to receive in the traditional manner. If you wish to receive a blessing instead of Communion, cross your arms over your chest. If your mobility is limited, please let an usher know and we will bring Communion to you. Glutenfree wafers are available. Just say "gluten-free" to the minister.

During the Offertory, as an act of gratitude and worship, we joyfully respond to God's gift to us in Jesus Christ by giving an offering to the Lord. We offer bread and wine, music, and financial resources towards God's work through his Church.






